WELCOME

Welcome to the **Cambridge International Jazz Festival 2016!** If you were one of over 5000 people who attended one of last year's events, welcome back, and thank you for your support in making the Festival such a success in its first year.

With over 30 headlining artists including Mercury Prize 2016 nominated soul singer-songwriter Laura Mvula at the Corn Exchange, Grammy award winning keyboardist Bill Laurance (of Snarky Puppy fame) at West Road Concert Hall, and MOBO award winners Sons of Kemet at The Junction, there is no shortage of quality on stage. British, Swedish and Danish trio Phronesis, "one of the most exciting bands on the planet today" according to Jazzwise magazine, perform at The Mumford Theatre. Danish vocalist and saxophonist Mads Mathias, and pianist Andrew McCormack from New York continue the international theme; and with home grown multi-award winning saxophonist and rapper Soweto Kinch, not to mention vocal award winning virtuosos Anita Wardell, Andi Hopgood and Cleveland Watkiss in the line-up, there is a fantastic array of talent coming to Cambridge this year.

Performing alongside them in 12 frantic days will be some of the finest jazz musicians from our own patch. In a day devoted to big band music you can come and hear **Harmony in Harlem** celebrate the music of **Duke Ellington**, and if you come early you can have a dance lesson from the **Cambridge Lindy Hoppers** beforehand to take full advantage. Cambridge University's premier a cappella group **Cadenza** will be performing alongside (or should that be against?) the fabulous **Oxford Gargoyles** in a night devoted to choral jazz, which also features the **Cambridge Jazz Festival Choir** on the bill, itself a product of last year's festival. **Soweto Kinch** will be performing as a special guest with Cambridge University's thrilling big band **CUJO**. And there are a whole host of fringe events scattered throughout the city during the festival where you can catch some of the best live jazz acts from our region and beyond.

The Festival is not just about listening, but also about getting involved, no matter what your age or ability. If playing in a big band is on your wish-list, come to the Big Band Workshop run by the brilliant bandleader and composer Josh Kemp; you'll get to play a composition written especially for the Festival. If singing in a jazz choir is more your thing, come and join London Vocal Project's Andi Hopgood for a workshop on jazz and groove singing, and then join her at her gig later that afternoon when you'll get a chance to perform what you've learned. New to the Festival is a focus on Latin music, with workshops from Shanti Paul Jayasinha and Jane Hollingworth which cater for instrumentalists and rhythm section players...or even for people who have never hit a drum in anger in their life! And, never shy about pushing the boundaries of what is considered "jazz", the Festival is thrilled to invite you to join a workshop with Soweto Kinch and local heroes Resolution 88 to explore the infectious grooves of jazz funk and hip hop. Snarky Puppy's Bill Laurance and his band will be running a masterclass on their approach to composition and improvisation which should bring you bang up to date, whilst Anita Wardell and Robin Phillips will be offering a chance to teach vocalists a trick or two. But if that all sounds a bit deep and you want to get to grips with the basics, pianist Nikki Iles and saxophonist Karen Sharp will be on hand to "de-mystify jazz" for you at their workshop at Miller's Music in town.

Also new this year are projects with artists from other genres, with a three-way collaboration between exploratory jazz group RipRap, beat-style bebop jazz poet Jazzman John Clarke, and dancer and choreographer Laura Brera. We now also have Jazz for Young Kids! Jazz singer, Sara Mitra has been collaborating with children's theatre company Magic Box for two interactive storytelling and music shows of 'A Magical Musical Storybox' - for young children ages 5 and under. There's a chance to quiz Mark Baxter, the producer of the documentary "Man in a Hurry" about the legendary Tubby Hayes before a screening of his film, and a performance from Hayes afficionado Simon Spillett and his quartet. Of course, there's a Jazz Kissa from Gearbox Records (look it up!). Fresh from their performance at the BBC Proms, the band Snowpoet will be combining music and poetry in an innovative live performance with award winning vocalist Lauren Kinsella. But if you prefer your poetry less scripted, anything could happen at The Burleigh Arms, which usually hosts Cambridge's regular jazz jam session, but for one night only plays host to Fay Roberts Jazz Poetry Slam which is open to all comers, both poets and musicians, for a night of improvisation, collaboration and experimentation. What could possibly go wrong?

So, whether it's welcome, or welcome back, we look forward to seeing you at this year's Cambridge International Jazz Festival. If you've been before, you know what's coming. If not, there's really only one way to find out....see you there.

FEATURED ARTWORK


This year's stunning artwork for the festival has been kindly provided by Cambridge based artist and furniture maker, **Loukas Morley**.
